GENERAL SAFETY IDEAS AND RULES From the Woodchuck Safety Video

Ten Basic Rules:

- 1. Take care of yourself
- 2. Never use gloves when operating equipment
- 3. Keep the shop dean
- 4. Always use machine guards
- 5. Don't over-reach
- 6. Know limitations of each machine
- 7. Be aware of pinch points
- 8. Be aware of kickback
- 9. Leave small cut off pieces until machine stops
- 10. Use safety devices (feather boards, push sticks, etc.)

Be sure you remember and use the 3" and 12" rule

POWER MITTER SAW

Make sure guard is working properly
Never cross your arms
Always adhere to the 3" rule
Start motor in the "up" position
Keep blade in pocket until it stops
For angle cuts, pull blade away from your body
Never put your hand inside the guard
Be aware of your body position (the saw is ambidextrous)

JOINTER

Always observe the 3" rule

Never operate machine without guards

Never pass your hands over the blades

Never join stock that is too small (less than 8" long and ¾" thick)

Keep cuts to less than 1/16" deep

Don't back work over blades

Keep your cut towards the outfeed table

Left hand holds, right hand pushes

Never use your thumb as a push stick

Walk through with the board

BAND SAW

Check blade tension and tracking
Follow the 3" rule
Don't use thumbs as push sticks
Do not cut short stock that is not flat
Never back out of a curved cut
Never clear small pieces while blade is moving

PLANER

Be aware of pinch points
Never run work that is less than 12" long or 3/8" thick
Stand to side of your work
Keep guards in place
Use dust collector
Watch for defects in boards
Don't put hands inside machine
Never wear gloves
Do not look into planer when it's running

ROUTER TABLE

Always feed from right to left
Use hold-down devices and push sticks
Don't forget 3" rule
Never pass hands or fingers over the cutting bit
Keep blades clean and sharp
Unplug machine when changing cutters
Use moderation – make several light passes

SANDERS

<u>Disk Sander</u>
Follow the 3" rule
Work on one half of disk
Be aware of pinch points

Oscillating Drum Sander
Be aware of pinch points
Use "filler" doughnuts to match drum

Horizontal (Belt) Sander
Be aware of pinch points
Maintain safe distance for fingers
Be mindful of kickback
Be aware of feed direction
Use dust collection

TABLE SAW

Stand facing the fence
Use safety devices – splitter, anti-kickback and shield and make sure
of proper alignment
Make adjustments when machine is OFF
Use push sticks
Never use miter gage with the fence
Use zero tolerance blade guard inserts
Have blade no more than ¼" above wood thickness
Don't remove small cutoffs until blade stops
Never saw "freehand"
